Starting a Little Free Library

- <u>Donors Choose</u> was our first step. Our class wanted to ask others to help us fund this
 project. I created the project on the Donors Choose website and began sharing with
 parents, friends, and family. You may have a different way to fund your project!
- You'll need to visit the <u>Little Free Library</u> starter site to help you find out the first steps to take (finding a location, choosing your library style, registering your library).
- Once your library has been delivered, you will want to design a special way to make your
 library stand out. My class decided to make a flower out of their handprints on the back. I
 did a protectant wood stain all over the box and let it dry for several days before
 painting each of their hands and placing them in a circle. Each child also signed their
 name in sharpie.
- I ordered an adhesive brass plaque from this <u>Etsy shop</u>. I had them print our school name,
 a small dedication, and the year.
- I purchased a mailbox post from Home Depot similar to the one here. My husband used a post hole digger first and then Quikrete once the hole was ready. We left that there for several days before the dedication to make sure it was completely dry and prepped.
- We attached the library with wood screws, nuts, and bolts.
- Use this link for some free and <u>printable bookmarks</u>. The kids chose several to color and I
 had them laminated. We placed a stack of these inside the library for others to take
 during their first visit to the library.
- Each child painted a rock to encircle the ground portion of the post.
- You'll want to plan a special day to dedicate the library. We invited parents and family to meet one night after school. It would be sweet to have your students create an invitation.
